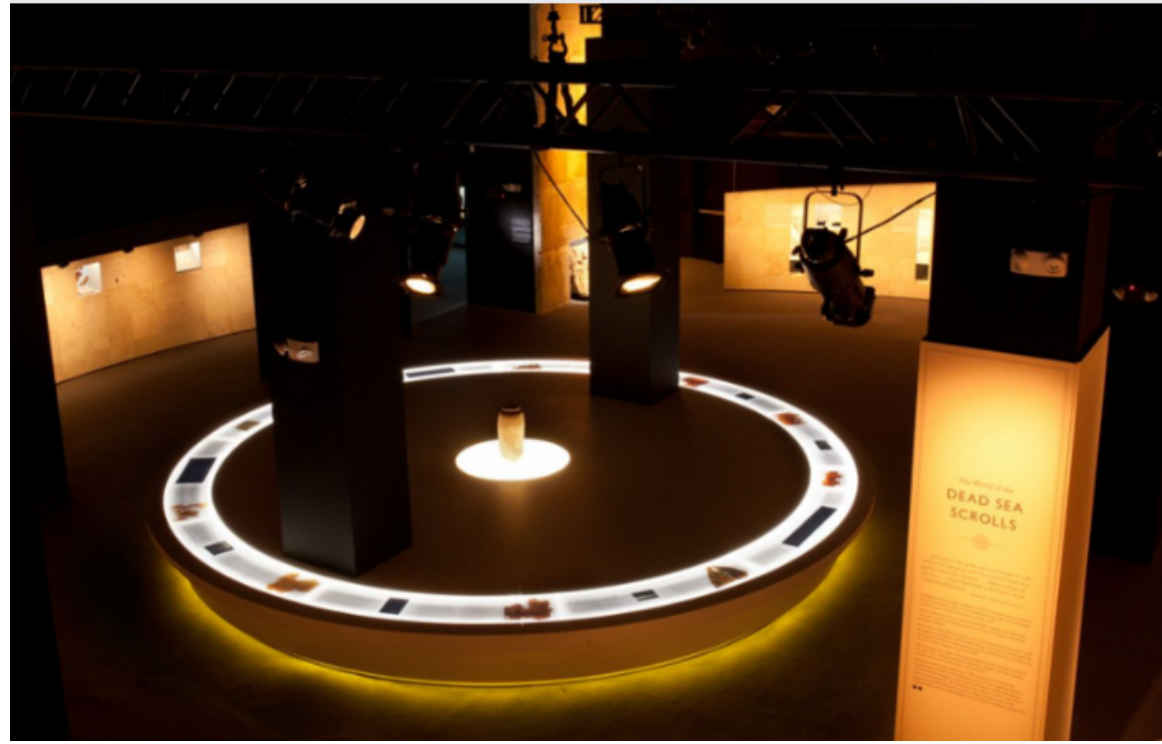
DEAD SEA SCROLLS

75th Anniversary Tour

Dating back to as early as the Third Century B.C.E., The Dead Sea Scrolls are among the oldest surviving documents known to humankind.

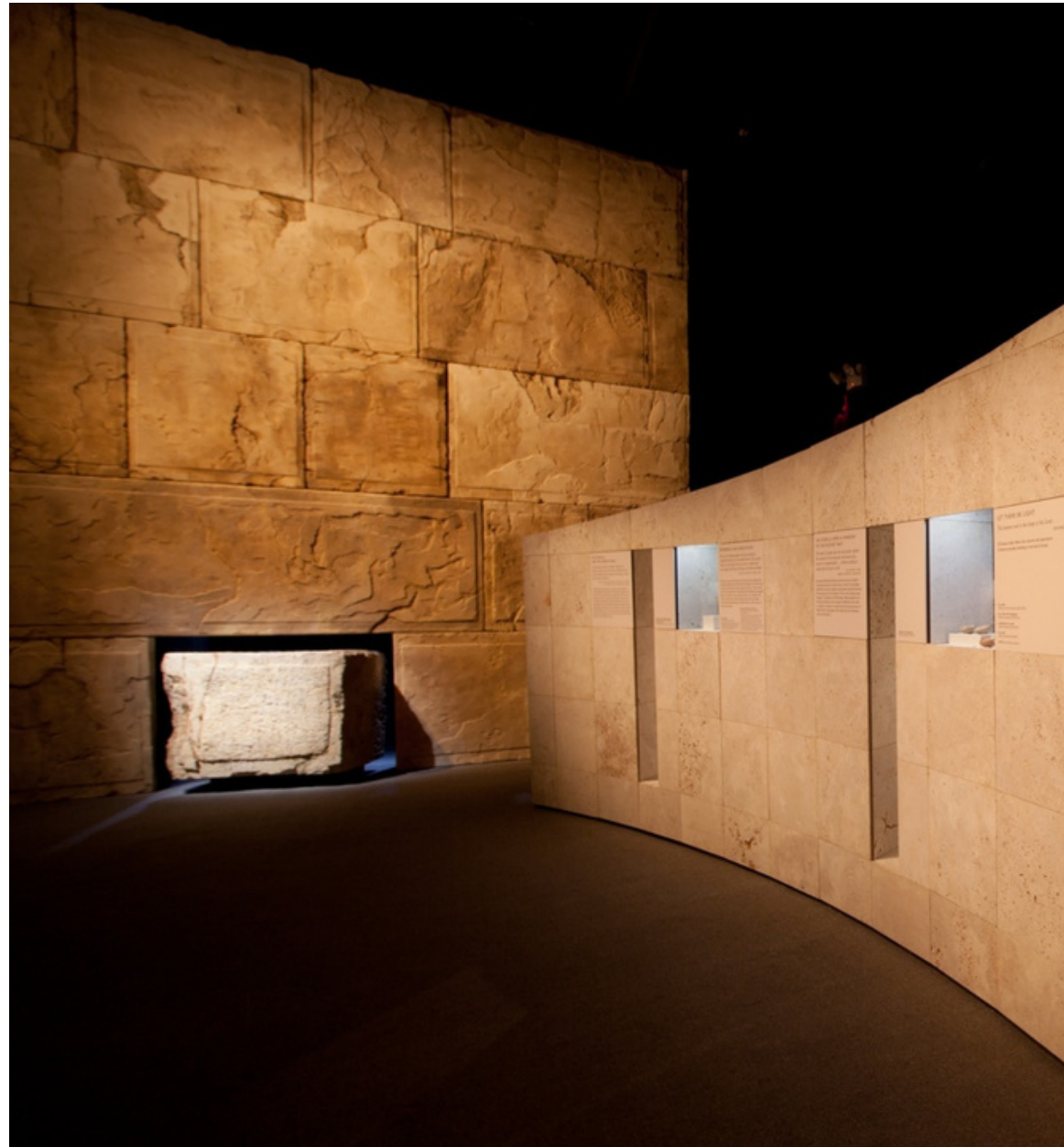
Celebrating 75 years since their discovery, Running Subway has the exclusive right to present the scrolls for a once-in-a-lifetime exhibition. This experience allows guests to step back in time through the history of the Dead Sea Scrolls: manuscripts composed, copied, and hidden in caves 2,000 years ago. The largest of its kind ever mounted outside of Israel, this exhibit features over 200 ancient artifacts and 24 original scrolls.





EXHIBITION HIGHLIGHTS

- 24 total scrolls; sets of 8 rotated every 3 months
- Viewing of over 200 ancient objects spanning from the First Temple period through the inception of Christianity
- A 3-ton stone from the Western Wall, believed to have fallen during the siege of Jerusalem in 70 C.E.
- International premiere of The Magdala Stone
- Science gallery dedicated to the technological advancements vital in understanding the scrolls'



DESERT ORIENTATION THEATRE



Enter the exhibition through an immersive media experience that gives guests a tour through the Levant and the history of the Dead Sea Scrolls.

BACK-TO-THE-PAST TIMELINE



As visitors move through time to Second Temple Israel, they examine its cultural history in detail while looking at the entire Mediterranean region for context.

THE SCROLL GALLERY



The original scroll jar sits at the center of the 8 scroll cases. The exhibition's main showpiece is accompanied by full English translations, hi-definition photographs, and contextual/historical explanations.

THE WESTERN WALL

Leaving a prayer at the Western Wall is seen as a sign of respect and reverence. This genuine piece of the Wall, accompanied by a live stream video of the Wall in Jerusalem, allows guests to transcend time and space.



THE MAGDALA STONE

- The Magdala Stone is a limestone block carved with symbols of the Temple in Jerusalem, many of which have yet to be decoded.
- Believed to have been a Torah-reading table from a first-century synagogue.
- Found in the town of Migdal, the presumed birthplace of Mary Magdalene, in 2009.

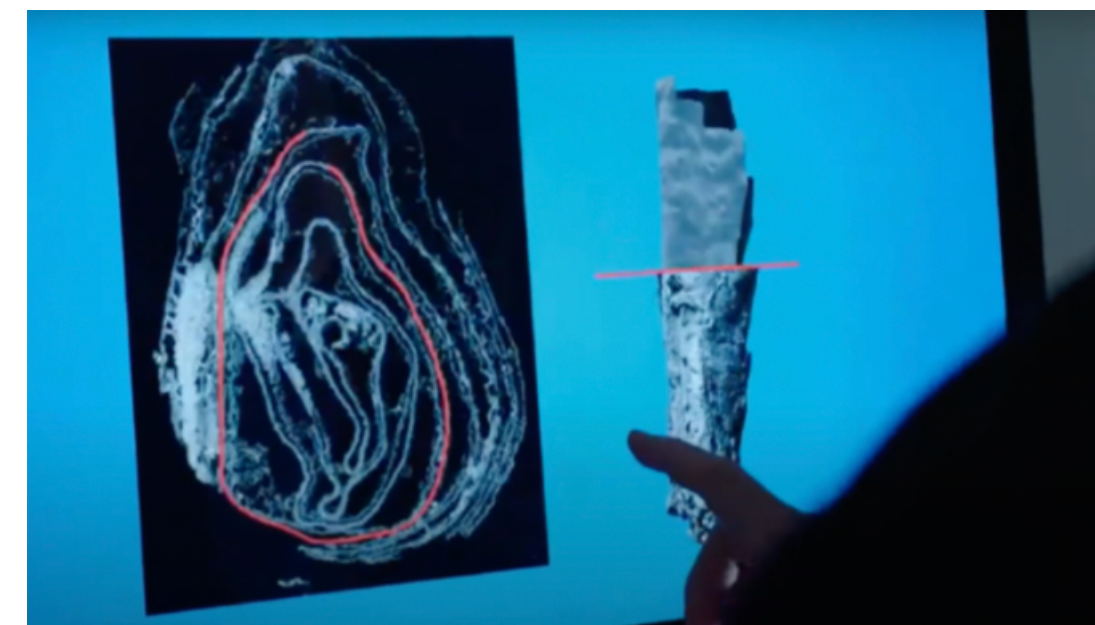
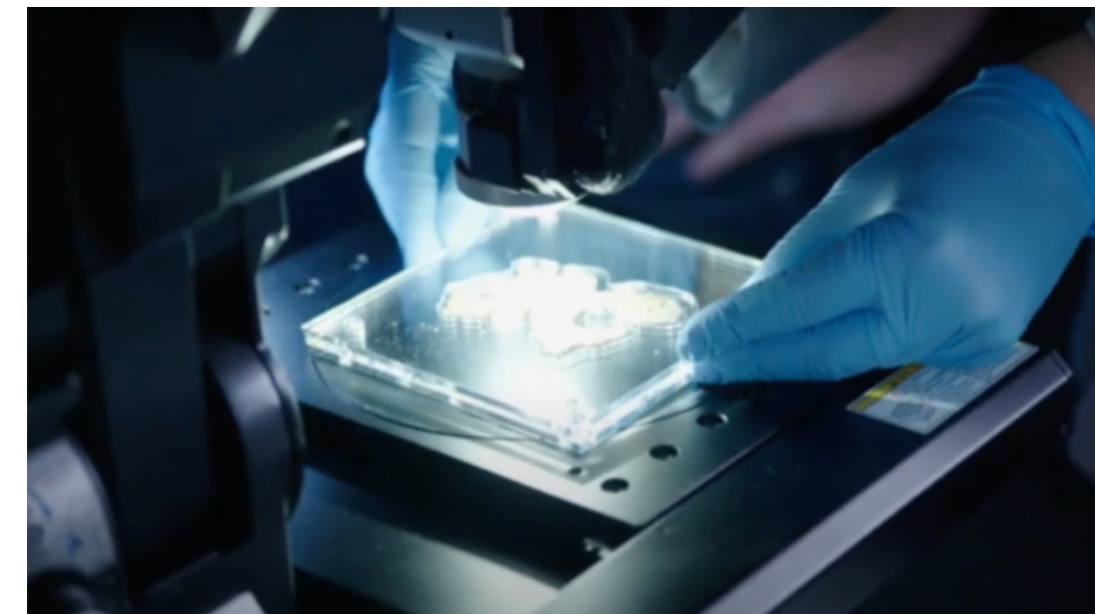


SCIENTIFIC ADVANCEMENTS

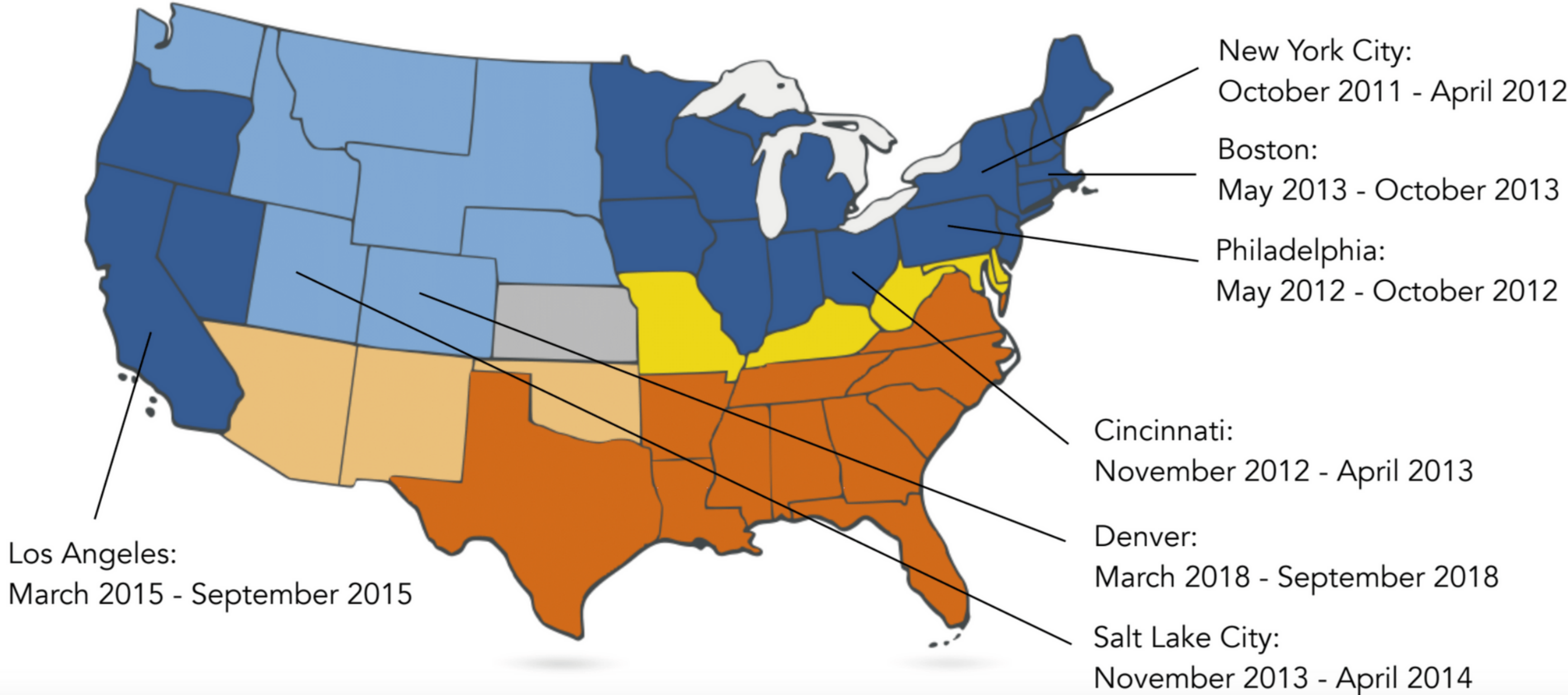
Thanks to a multi-spectral imaging system designed by NASA engineers, the scroll fragments are now able to be further documented & studied.

In addition to these innovative imaging systems, a combination of CT scans, digital mapping, & AI have allowed even the most fragile, carbonized remnants to be digitally restored & unfurled!

These scientific advancements are an intrinsic aspect of the 75th Anniversary exhibition.

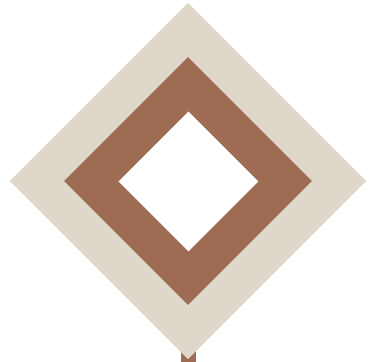
